

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

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# TECH TIP-----To Change the Oil or Not to Change the Oil? That's the Transmission Question

This issue, Tech Advisor Jeff Otten explains the benefits of doing a X5 automatic transmission oil change.

> s article chronicles maintenance on our 2005 X5 3.0 with a GM automatic transmission. The automatic in the E53 X5 generally works well and is a good fit for this type of vehicle. It is called an A5S 390R transmission and has 5 speeds. Our car has about 176k as of this article. This X5 is an X-drive version so the ratio of front to

X-Drive: the all wheel drive system BMW utilizes in vehicles. This system adapts based on changing driving conditions to redirect power to each axle. Works with ABS and DSC.

rear power changes with the driving conditions.

The factory recommendation for this vehicle for the automatic transmission requires maintenance at 100,000 miles with a filter change. These transmissions were built with Texaco ETL 8072B fluid which is no longer available. This fluid is a brown fluid different from normal red transmission fluid. Doing some Internet searches reveals the consensus that this a good fluid but nothing special compared to other synthetics available. When I changed the oil the first time BMW dealers were selling Valvoline Dexron 6 fluid to go in these transmissions. When built, the GM specification was Dexron 4. The main difference in the fluids is that Dexron 6 is formulated for better mileage, with a lower viscosity. GM normally considers all new fluids to be backward compatible. However, lower viscosity seems contrary to friction plate function. Automatics rely on friction plate transfer of the forces to work. When the plates are worn out, the transmission will slip.

Searching for fluid recommendations, I found for BMW automatics two (2) consistent recommendations, Redline D4 or Amsoil Multi ATF. It seemed for ZF brand the Amsoil had good

Mobil 1 product did not seem to be recommended for the BMW/GM transmission so I went with Redline D4. This, of course, is not a BMW approved the recommendation. For the transfer case, it works by a

results. On my Suburban I used Mobil 1 ATF. The

solenoid applying pressure to a friction plate to divert power from the rear to the front of the car. The oil is a special oil that there are no equivalents sold. The BMW oil is about \$50.00 per liter (with club discount). The good thing is it takes only about .8 liter so only one bottle is needed. For the 2005 X5, this fluid is supposed to be changed at every 50k miles. I don't think most dealers know this, so it likely does not get changed this often. Also when you change the fluid the computer is supposed to be reset, as the friction of new fluid is higher than old fluid. I had my car reset once at the dealer (cub tech event, thanks to BMW North). The BMW transmission has a drain plug in the pan and a fill plug in the body. The transmission has to warm when filling the last amount. The Bentley manual says the fluid should be 85 to 120F for filling. Total transmission capacity is now listed at 9.0 liters (9.5 qt) with the torque converter and 8.0 liters (8.5 qt) without. My experience is for a pan drain only about 4.5 quarts, for the filter and pan drain about 8 to 8.25 quarts. So plan on 5 quarts for pan drain and 9 quarts for filter replacement. Be ready with 2 drain pans. The X5 is pretty easy to drain and fill.

To change the filter the pan has to be removed, it will be necessary to disconnect the mid exhaust pipe hanger to allow the pan bolts and pan to be dropped. This time I used a Quick lack to lift the car but had enough room last time just putting the car on  $2 \times 12$ 's, since the car is fairly high already. For passenger cars, if you don't have a lift, support the car on four (4) jack stands to get it high enough. It's important to get the car close to level. When I removed the pan the filter fell out. The seal was worn and loose, no longer a tight fit. Hence the slipping cause was now known. Unfortunately, I had already bought the same filter so put it in any way. Had I run the filter only 50k, I would have not had a problem.

The original seal is a different and better design. Original BMW filter kit is about \$120 though. After-market Meistersatz was about \$35 and includes new bolts, pan gasket, filter, and seals, so after reading reports on forums I bought




this one again. Since I had some cold slipping, and after some Internet searching, I bought a bottle of Lucas Transmission Fix, about \$12 (auto parts or Wal-Mart). According to the website it can be used for preventative maintenance and will help to stop slipping and seal leaks. Normally I don't use "snake oil" and I don't know if I would put this in if I had it to do over.

The original BMW/GM filter seal is difficult to remove. One Internet trick is to use a 1/2" PVC pipe nipple to thread into it, then pull it out. I used a right angle bend screwdriver and was able to get it out. The Meistersatz seal does not have a metal external can so is easier to install. The fluid from the transmission and the transfer case should be drained warm. Nitrile gloves (Harbor Freight) are suggested. The transmission plugs have integrally molded seals, so should be re-useable. A small amount of RTV silicone gasket sealer can be used if in doubt. The transfer case uses copper crush washers, they seem to be an odd size compared to generic assortments so remember to pick these up from the dealer, PN 07119963308 (18mm x 22mm CU), two (2) required.

Clean the gasket surfaces well. A gasket scraper and a wipe with brake cleaner work well. The new gasket is aluminum with a rubber insert and seemed to have a light brown coating, so no additional gasket sealer was used. New bolts M6 X 1MM were provided, I used them and put a drop of blue Loctite on each one. Tighten evenly with a cross pattern in stages. Final torque should be 10 Nm (90 in-lb).

**Nitrile Gloves: Rubber** gloves 2.0. More resistant to chemicals and less likely to tear when working on the car

Brake Cleaner: Not just for brakes. Good to keep in the garage to clean greasy car parts.

I flushed a small amount of fluid through the transfer case then put the plug in. Fill until a small stream comes out, and let run till about 1/16" size stream then put the plug in.

Fill the automatic transmission till the fluid runs out then put the plug in. Then start the car. Let it run a couple minutes, then shift through all gears with the brake held on. Monitor the transmission temperature, the Raytek Autopro Laser Thermometer works well for this. The fluid will fill the torque converter so the pan level will go down. Once it warms a little, add fluid quick enough to keep the temperature in the range. I found it heats pretty quickly so do final level at close to 120 F. Check the temperature in several places on the pan and transmission housing. Once it's full to temperature put the plug in, with a small stream coming out. Do not remove the plug again with engine off, or a lot of fluid will gush out.

The Lucas additive is very thick, it was divided part into the fill bottle with the Redline fluid. The transmission now has about 3k more miles and drives perfectly. Next time I will use a better filter, maybe BMW, and probably just fill with Redline D4.

After doing this work, I think the idea that dirty fluid is better and longer lasting is a myth Like all mechanical devices, proper lubrication will reduce wear and prolong life. A fluid drain and fill at 30 to 50k miles is not unreasonable and filter changes allow more residual particles to be removed, so has to reduce wear.

Better to have clean fluid replaced at reasonable intervals.

# LUCKY US GRAND PRIX OCT 19 - 21 NUMBERS EVENTS

A weekend of drama and excitement: The US Grand Prix awards both Redemption and Disappointment

eturning for the seventh time, Formula 1 brings into Austin a season-long battle between Mercedes driver, Lewis Hamilton and Scuderia Ferrari driver Sebastian Vettel and with only four races left in the season, every lap mattered. This is my second year of going to see the race and I enjoyed another weekend filled with great racing. Like most sports, seeing the cars on the track in person is nothing like watching on TV.

Located 15 miles southeast of Austin in the rolling hills which provide iconic elevation changes throughout the 3.41-mile track, The Circuit of the Americas track design provides unique challenges to drivers and exciting racing for spectators. Nicknamed CoTA by enthusiasts, racing series of all levels from Formula 1 to BMW M Days host events throughout the year at this venue for all levels of drivers.

Millions and millions of dollars go into funding the development of a formula 1 team. Tracks are analyzed and reanalyzed but a lucky start is all it takes to change the narrative of a weekend.

Through 17 different tracks, Lewis Hamilton and Sebastian Vettel battled to be the first to 5 world titles, the third driver to accomplish this sense formula 1 started. Their 18th fight took place in Austin. Hamilton dominated at the previous race in Suzuka, Japan growing his lead over Vettel by an additional 25 points. This race was a must win for Vettel to hold onto to any chance of winning the world championship. Hamilton won last year in Austin after taking pole in qualifying. To win the race, you need to qualify well. In order for Hamilton to repeat his win in Austin, it started with a strong performance in qualifying.

Hamilton did take pole but another accomplished driver took the top step at the end of a very damp weekend. Kimi Räikkönen. His first win in 112 races. Hamilton settled for 3rd and Vettel took 4th. The 2018 title did not get decided in Austin this year that would happen later in Mexico. While Räikkönen kept Hamilton from scoring the necessary points he needed to clinch his fifth world title, Vettel once again





came up short after a series of mistakes that plagued the second half of his season.

While there is plenty of excitement on the track, it only takes up a small portion of the day. There are autograph sessions throughout the weekend. If you are interested in meeting your favorite driver plan on getting over the meet and greet area 2 hours before. Haas F1 has a special fan appreciation session near Haas Hill (turn 18) each year. Each year the USGP organizers bring in top talent for the Saturday and Sunday night concerts. This year Britney Spears performed and Bruno Mars. Justin Timberlake performed in 2017 and Taylor Swift came in 2016. CoTA has the largest outdoor amphitheater in central Texas and is a great venue for the top artists this event attracts year after year.

Watching the events at the track makes for a long day and I would plan to at least have lunch at the track. Event officials discourage fans from bringing in outside food, however, you can bring an arctic water bottle or swell bottle in a backpack. Some people leave coolers in their cars and "tailgate" for lunch. There are several vendors inside. At the track, there is your typical stadium food (hot dogs, chicken fingers, hamburgers, French fries, nachos) around the track. In addition, in the central area, several food trucks come into the track. My favorite is the BBQ mac cheese with brisket or the brisket nachos. Both make for excellent lunch in between track sessions and pair nicely with a cold beer. There are 2 beer pavilions, 1 by turn 18 which is near the food trucks and the second is back by turn 4. They have about 10-15 beers on tap and the selection is different at each location so if you are looking for something specific on a hot day it might be worth the hike to get a good craft beer. Also in the pavilion, there are several tables and picnic tables and fans to sit at away from the sun.

One downside to CoTA is how far it is from Austin, all the hotel options are at least 30 minutes away. Some club members like to stay in Bastrop but there is not much to do in the evening. I recommend staying off of I35 in Austin. These hotels are more centrally located which gives more options for dining and access to off-track events throughout the weekend, especially if you are not interested in staying for the concerts on Saturday and Sunday night. My Dad and I skipped the concert on Saturday night and opted to head back to the hotel for dry clothes and a warm shower then headed out for dinner in Austin. While out for dinner, we found an off-track F1 Experience shop that had discounted hats and shirts from previous seasons and races that were heavily discounted compared to track prices.

Formula 1 will return to Austin again next year. The event has moved to the first weekend in November, which means you should plan for hot weather or cold weather or wet weather. There is no telling what kind of fall weather we will have next year in Texas. I would definitely pack rain gear and shoes that will get you through the mud if it does rain. There are lots of grassy areas to watch the race and they get very muddy with a couple of days of repeated rain.

# A Driving Experience for All Levels

Driving Events Chair, Richard Lo offers his advice on how to get involved in track events. In 2019 Houston Chapter members will be eligible to participate in two events hosted at the Circuit of the Americas in Austin. This is a great opportunity to feel the limits of your Bavarian machine or improve driving skills while receiving instruction from knowledgeable experienced instructors.

#### What is Austin Schnell Fest?

"Schnell" is the German word for "fast". The Austin Schnell Fest is a Driver Education event for novice to advance drivers held at the Circuit of the Americas (COTA) Formula 1 racetrack located in Austin, TX. This event is sponsored by the Houston BMW CCA Chapter and the Lone Star, Hill Country, and Maverick Porsche Club of America (PCA) Regions. The event is run under PCA Driving Education minimum standards.

#### When is Austin Schnell Fest?

Schnellfest is scheduled for June 8-9 and September 21-22.

#### Who can participate in Schnell Fest?

Anyone 18 years or older in good health with a valid driver's license.

#### What do you need to participate?

1.In order to participate your car must have a technical inspection not more than 30 days prior to the event. The car owner must certify that the car is safe to run on the track and that the car has been inspected by a dealer or other reputable automobile repair facility. Both a representative of the inspecting dealer/repair shop and the owner must complete the Technical Inspection Form.

2.A "K", "M", or "SA" helmet with a Snell certification of 2015 or newer. 3.Sign up and pay the registration fee at https://clubregistration.net

#### I have never participated in a track event, where can I learn about track driving?

Schnell Fest is open to drivers of all skill levels to include beginners with no track experience. Drivers are assigned to the following groups based on skill level and experience:

4.White – Experienced Drivers

5.Red – Instructors

1.Green – Beginner Drivers 2.Blue – Novice Drivers 3.Yellow-Intermediate/ Experienced Drivers

#### How many days is Schnellfest? How long am I on track each day? Schnell Fest is either a two or three day event. Each day you will have 4 driving session no less than 20 minutes each and two classroom instructional sessions.

#### Are there instructors available?

All participants are assigned an instructor regardless of skill level. Beginner and non-solo Novice drivers will have in car instructors at all times while on track.

# **BMW Returns to Open Wheel Racing** Powered by a motor not an engine

The ABB FIA Formula E is the first fully electric international single-seater street racing series. Hosting 12 events over a seven-month series with 11 teams with 22 drivers this 5th season will be the most competitive season yet. BMW i partnered with Andretti Racing to field 2 cars in the 2018/2019 season. This all-electric racing series offers BMW a unique testing environment to develop the technology that will be incorporated into their electric road vehicles. This will be the first season with the Gen2 car, the second iteration of a Formula E car. The batteries powering the Gen2 car are bigger and more efficient than the Gen1 model eliminating the need for a midrace car swap this year. Each team will get the same chassis and batteries but are on their own to develop the electric motor, inverter, gearbox and cooling system.

Organizers also changed the racing format in the 2018/2019 season include the addition to the Attack Mode. Nickednamed "Mario Kart" drivers must drive over specific areas off the driving line to pick up additional boosts of power to help decrease lap time and move up in place. The theme of the series is efficiency in all things, not just the cars. The cars are powered by 100% renewable fuel from Formula É's Glycerine Generators. The races are clustered together by region to use boat, train or road transport to move

grabs at the end of the season, a driver's title and a constructor's title. Points are award to drivers finishing in 10th place or better. Additional points are awarded for winning pole and for fastest lap. The race weekend schedule includes a practice session on Friday called the Shakedown. During this session, cars are operated at reduced power and use the track time to test the reliability, not performance. On Saturday during the two practice sessions team can run the cars in race mode. Qualifying is held on Saturday after the conclusion of the practice sessions. On Sunday the E-Prix begins with a standing start and lasts for 45 minutes. After the time has elapsed and the leader crosses the finish line there is one more lap until the race ends. During the E-Prix fans can vote for their favorite driver to receive a 5-second boost of power which can only be used during the second half of the race. Race schedules vary by event and can be
